



# 1940s Weekend at Upton <u>House</u> Sat & Sun 30 &31 May

When World War Two broke out the world changed and none more so than at Upton House.



Lord and Lady Bearsted moved down to The Dorchester Hotel in London and their Merchant Bank, M Samuel and Co moved into Upton House with all their staff for the duration of the war.

On 30 and 31 May, Upton House will reflect all that was happening at that time with two Home Guard groups camped on site giving marching displays, stripping guns down and helping children to understand what happened during the war in the countryside. The ARP and WVS will be on hand to discuss the work of air raid wardens and the work the women's voluntary service did in the community. The Upton Estate was worked by the ladies of the women's land army, who will also be with us and to cap it all we will have a real 1940s pub serving real beers and soft drinks.

Of course a weekend at Upton would not be complete without music and Paul Casper will be playing the Ukulele on the rear terrace as the dynamic George Formby, whist the ladies parade the fashions of the day.

Victoria Wright, Marketing and Events Manager said, "This project is the biggest transformation Upton has ever had and this event is going to be a really exciting weekend to kick off our schedule of major events. Our visitors will really get a feel for wartime Upton and feel immersed in the 1940s both inside and outside the house."



## **SHUTFORD VILLAGE HALL**

### **CHAIRMAN'S REPORT - May 2015**

Activity in the Hall during the 2014-15 year has been interesting with the well attended 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Tea Party, which carried details of the proposed new building and a splendid display of our history since inception in 1954. The user groups have remained unchanged during the year, with the Mums and Toddlers still our most regular user. The Church has increased its bookings, holding fund raising events and the children's 'Messy Church' fun days.

The committee has seen a few changes when Athene Duffield and Rose Hancock resigned their positions towards the end of the year and we must thank both of them for their support and help over the years. Athene was our Deputy Chair and I must thank Gordon Freeman for stepping in to replace her. We look forward to welcoming Helen Gibbs to the committee when she takes on the roll of representing the Parish Council from Athene. The committee met its usual four times during the year and we were very pleased to have Lynne Parsons, now replacing Margaret Holloway as the Women's Institute representative. Our regular cleaner, Gus Freeman, has left to study at University and was replaced by Nathaniel Sabin at the end of last year, so we have many new faces on the team now.

Maintenance has been restricted to essential repairs comprising a couple of minor electrical issues and a sticking main entrance door that caused not one but two door handles to be ripped off their mounting plates.

The most important topic that has occupied the minds and time of our committee during the whole year has been the progress of the project towards a new Village Hall. Following a majority decision by the committee to support replacement of the hall with a new building on the same site, planning permission was applied for and obtained earlier this year with many letters of support having been received by the Planning Officer. Funding for the project has also progressed with a pledge of £100,000, some grant aid from the Doris Field Trust, a comedy magic show by 'Carl and Dave' plus an increasing flow of money coming from the easyfundraising website and a number of other donations. We hope that the bulk of the remaining funding will be raised through a Public Works Loan of £150,000 to be repaid through a precept on our Council Tax. Work on this is currently on-going and the committee would urge all our parishioners to support it through the survey shortly to be conducted on behalf of the Parish Council. If this is successful, then the Trustees of our charity will also be able to release funds currently held in reserves specifically associated with the existing building.

The on-going fund raising activities will supplement our finances and we must thank Margaret Holloway, Joan Wright and Athene for their work with the 100+Club, the Christmas Bingo, plus all the villagers for the efforts and generosity with the Festival, which benefits the Hall, the Church and the Community Association.

# The Annual General Meeting of the Parish Council took place at 7.00pm on Wednesday May 6th 2015 in the village hall.

Present were Cllrs Miss H Gibbs, Mrs L Parsons, Mrs A Duffield, Mrs R Hancock, Mr M Goldie & Mr A Taylor. Apologies from Mr J Yeomans. Also present were District Cllr D Webb, County Cllr G Reynolds and 5 members of the public.

**Elections** The following were elected to the relevant positions CHAIRMAN Cllr Taylor proposed by Cllr Goldie seconded by Cllr Hancock V-CHAIRMAN Cllr Goldie proposed by Cllr Duffield seconded by Cllr Taylor.

The following responsibilities were agreed after a proposal by Cllr Goldie seconded by Cllr Hancock. Transport representative Cllr Duffield, Allotment representative Cllr Goldie; NAG representative Cllr Gibbs; Village Hall representative Cllr Gibbs; responsibility for The Dairyground Cllr Parsons and responsibility for other assets Cllr Yeomans.

**Urgent business:** Survey for the village hall will be taken under matters arising.

**Interests:** Cllr Goldie declared an interest in planning apps 15/00500/F & 15/00449/LB

**The minutes** of the last meeting were signed as a correct record after a proposal by Cllr Goldie seconded by Cllr Hancock. **Matters arising Highways:** The Clerk reported some potholes had been filled but not all, some white lines had been repainted but she had had no response to concerns over the state of the Epwell Road and moving the 30 mph limits. Cllr Duffield will follow up on the potholes in Epwell Road.

**Speed Checks**: TVP have now been in touch. The Clerk to check the availability of the volunteers and arrange a meeting

**Grass verges:** A resident has complained about the state of the verge in front of their house. This is the result of OCC only cutting them twice a year. The Clerk has contacted OCC to find out how much they would grant the village, the exact area to be cut and the name of the contractor. When these details are available the Council will look at the possibility of arranging more cuts.

**Dog litter bin**: This will be erected in the field at the top of Church Lane in the next 14 days. CDC have notified the PC that the cost of emptying the bin has gone up from £110 to £121 per year. Many thanks to the Cadburys for the agreement to have this installed.

**NAG:** Cllr Gibbs had heard nothing, District Cllr Webb offered to inform her of future dates. A comment was made regarding neighbourhood watch.

**The telephone box**: The newly renovated box is now in situ at the Jame Corner thanks to the SCA. It is now insured. It was agreed that for the present it could possibly be used as a library with a map of the village on the wall. Any ideas and suggestions for its future use gratefully received.

**The village hall**: A meeting has been arranged for Monday 11<sup>th</sup> May to finalise the village survey. It was agreed after a proposal by Cllr Duffield seconded by Cllr Parsons that the Chairman be given authority to confirm the sending out of the survey provided it was agreed by the working group.

**The Dairyground:** The Council agreed on the bench to be purchased to replace the damaged one.

**Allotments:** No report

**Finance:** One cheque was signed at the meeting to Alexander Rose for the new bench. The accounts for the year were agreed proposed by Cllr Parsons seconded by Cllr Duffield, the Chairman then signed the audit form ready for internal audit

**Planning:** App 15/00223/F a greenhouse at Lower Barn for Mr Goodwin has been passed. App 15/00218/F a terrace of 5 houses at The Cottage, Ivy Lane for Hawkins Estates has been refused for access, parking and overdevelopment in line with PC objections.

There are no PC objections to Apps 15/00500/F & 15/00449/LB extension to outhouse for Mr M Goldie at Honeysuckle Cottage, Lower End nor to app 15/00619/F a new pull in for Mr & Mrs Gillespie at Drogheda. Malthouse Lane.

**Correspondence:** This has been circulated. Nobody wished to attend the Parish Liaison meeting.

**AOB**: It was agreed to thank Martin Doe for the website which will used be more often by the PC under the new transparency rules.

# The Feather Forecast for Shutford:

# **Bird Ringing**

What is bird ringing or more specifically scientific bird ringing.

Ringing is a method used to individually mark a bird so that recordings can be made when the bird is recaptured or found dead. The ringing technique is an effective way of studying the movements, behavior, breeding habits & population demographics of our birds. By capturing birds at regular intervals allows us to track the migratory routes including the staging areas, so providing vital information needed to ensure that protected areas can be set up to help them on their journey. Other information derived from recaptures is population size, survival lifetime & reproductive success rates within given periods. The ringing & data collection is undertaken by well trained & qualified licensed amateurs who are motivated by a love of birds & their conservation & welfare. Because there are over 4 million birds ringed in Europe alone that freely migrate across all borders it needs a very efficient organization to collect, collate & process the data.

There are several ways of ringing birds the most commonly used are: ringing the chicks in the nest, using a mist net to capture & ring or recapture & record & rocket nets which are used for capturing larger birds on the ground whereby a strong net is launched by a series of rockets over the ground flock. The rings which can be metal or plastic are attached to the leg of the bird & contain a unique series of letters & numbers. This code is used to identify the bird when recaptured & specific information can be logged against it such as location, date, etc. Measurements of the bird's anatomy are also taken in order to check its growth, health & well being. GPS tags are also used to track birds by satellite.

One of the oldest wild birds ever recorded is a Manx Shearwater, first captured & ringed in 1957 at around 6 years old, caught again in 1961, 1978 & 2002 making it over 50 years old.

# Things of interest locally:

The winter has been very good to the birds this year for the 2<sup>nd</sup> year in a row with no snow & very few prolonged periods of frost or frozen ground. This suited birds such as the thrush & blackbird that feed on the invertebrates buried in the earth. Jays seem to be plentiful & there is the usual drumming of the great spotted woodpecker. I witnessed for the first time a female great spotted wood pecker drumming in a tree & within a few minutes a male bird had landed, mated & flown away, job done. Quite a few yellow hammers & green finches in the hedgerows looking for nest sites. House sparrows are nesting in the eaves of the house so let's hope they increase in numbers this season. Still 5 years without hearing a cuckoo in Shutford maybe we will get one this year, keep your ears pricked. The winter visitors have all but gone making room for the summer migrants.




# **Shutford Book Club**





The Lent Lunch on 30<sup>th</sup> March raised £230 for Banbury Young Homeless Project\*. More than 30 people from across the benefice enjoyed a variety of homemade soups, bread and cheese and simnel cake. To help with their day to day needs, we have a box in church to receive non perishable food for their store cupboard in Banbury.

This year's Jar of Change Appeal held during Lent raised £315 for Water Aid\*. 12 people took part and the amount collected was the highest ever for a Lent appeal. Thank you letters\* have been received.

Our Paschal Candle holder has been repaired/rebuilt by Tom Gibbs and is in pride of place in church by the pulpit. We are grateful to him.

The Easter Day Service was well attended. The church was beautifully decorated with spring flowers and the PCC is grateful to the village ladies who donate and arrange flowers all year round. Everyone was offered an Easter egg as they left church.

A successful Benefice Quiz Night was held at North Newington Sports and Social Club. Sadly no team represented Shutford with just two volunteers: were the usual village quiz teams scared of the competition?

Christian Aid Week took place in the week beginning 10<sup>th</sup> May: last year we collected £272. The charity is 70 years old this year and the theme of the appeal is a woman named Loko: she dreads the chore of collecting wood to sell to provide food for her children. She has a dream to own a cow which will provide milk for the family and also income. A cow costs about £150. As there has been no door to door collection in Shutford this year for Christian Aid (nor Red Cross) could we collect enough money to buy one? It`s less than a £1 per household! Find out more at caweek.org. Donations would be gratefully received.

22 people had great fun at the Beetle Drive on 16<sup>th</sup> May: the adult top scorer was Andy Whitehouse and junior Gabriel Doe. £100 was raised.

The next Messy Church Event will be in Shutford Village Hall on Saturday  $14^{th}$  June 4.00 pm - 6.00 pm. This is ideal for young children and their parents/guardians with crafts, a story and refreshments. These events are enjoyed by all involved but very often there are more helpers than children so please make an effort to come on  $14^{th}$ .

Our usual church service is at 9.30am on a Sunday with a short Morning Prayer meeting on Saturday at 9.00am. A less formal service is held on the third Sunday of the month at 11.00am with refreshments and time to chat afterwards. We have a core congregation of about 20 and about 40 others who come to church at sometime during the year. Others support fund raising and care about the church but do not worship. Should we be concerned that the congregation is not growing? Is there a need for a church in every village? How can we encourage more involvement with church and become part of 2015 lifestyles?

If organised worship is not for you, you can still use our church as it is open daily for everyone to spend time for some peace and quiet. The churchyard is full of wild flowers at this time of year and is worth a visit: you can watch the world go by from the seat in the churchyard.

The church building has recently been inspected and our architect has highlighted some work needed but nothing of major concern. Fund raising is never easy so we hope that the Festival in June will help to support the church, village hall and community association with their various projects. Special thanks to Rita Livesey and organising group.

The Crown Nominations Committee has failed to find a suitable candidate to put forward as a prospective new Bishop of Oxford. Rt Revd Colin Fletcher, Bishop of Dorchester, will continue to oversee the running of the Oxford Diocese probably until the end of 2016.




