Shutford gains funds for new village hall

After tireless fundraising Shutford has finally raised enough money to replace its dilapidated village hall.

The current village hall was opened in 1954 but has now reached the end of its working life.

The final injection of funds was made possible due to the success of June's Shutford Summer Festival.

Now in its third year, the festival raised just under £7,000, a portion of which went towards the village hall rebuilding project.

Work on the new hall will take place in two stages; phase 1 will begin in early September and will result in the completion of the building's structure. Phase 2 will follow with villagers donating their time and skills to complete a village hall they can be proud of.
