

The Shutford Book Review EXCELLENT WOMEN BY BARBARA PYM

The November book was Excellent Women by Barbara Pym, a book hailed by critics in two different eras - when it was written, in 1952, and again in the 1970s, thanks to a favourable review by none less than Philip Larkin.

Mildred Lathbury is a clergyman's daughter and a dogooder spinster in 1950s London. She is labelled as a prime example of "excellent women" - the smart, supportive, endeavouring women

who men take utterly for granted. As she gets embroiled in the lives of her new neighbours - with barely a likeable character among them - the novel presents snapshots of human life as actually, and pluckily, lived in a dreary, post-war world of repressed desires and dreams.

Excellent Women is often rated as one of Barbara Pym's richest and most amusing comedies. It's even compared with Jane Austen. However, our members gave it an average of 3.5 out of 5. We appreciated the social commentary but, in our modern world, found much of it dreary and tedious rather than comic, even though there were lots of funny episodes, encounters and one-liners.



Church news

Advent Sunday, 27th November, the start of the new church year, was celebrated with Holy Communion. The following Sunday, Rev Neil led worship at our Benefice Eucharist in Shutford with a choir and our friends from across the benefice. Many staved for refreshments in church after the service. There are no flowers in church during Advent, but we did have an Advent Wreath and a Christmas Tree installed at the front of the church with a second one in the churchyard overlooking Church Lane. The outdoor one was donated by Wykeham Park Farm and was decorated with solar lights from early December until Epiphany, 6th January. The church tower was illuminated each evening from 10th December until 8th January as part of our Lights of Love campaign: thanks to everyone who made donations recently and throughout the year enabling this initiative to continue. Flowers and greenery returned to the church for Christmas with thanks to our team of ladies for donating and arranging them. It was also good to see many properties throughout the village illuminated for Christmas with special thanks to the Advent Windows participants and Lisa S for organising them.

Specially printed Christmas cards were delivered to every household in the village with an invitation to join us for our Advent and Christmas Celebrations. It is difficult to know if they were appreciated but the sentiment behind them was well meant, people of all faiths or none are always welcome in St Martin's Church. Thanks to Mervyn for providing the photo of a snowy church. Our Fun Family Church Event was held in the village hall on 10th December – we had 22 in the hall including 11 children. There were Christmas crafts, the making of Christingles, Godly play featuring the Nativity and refreshments to finish. These events, which do have a Christian theme, are informal and free, and we hope that more invited families will join us in future. The following weekend we had candlelit carols and readings in church with tea and coffee to finish. It was good to have a full church for the carols and on Christmas Day morning to celebrate this special time of year.

After two years dominated by the coronavirus, church attendance in 2022 was the highest for 20 years boosted by three weddings, three Christenings and

two memorial services. On a normal Sunday we have an average of 9 people at a service, ranging from 5 – 15. We have a core congregation of about 30, of whom half worship at least once a month. In addition to services in our various churches on Sundays and during the week, there has been online worship on a Wednesday and Sunday evening for those who are unable to come to church in person. Our rector, Rev Neil Bowler has Rev Canon John Tattersall, an Associate Minister and Jocelyn Merris, a Licenced Lay Minister to help him, with retired clergy leading worship on a regular basis. There are also lay led services. Although our congregation remains stable, it is not increasing, and the challenge continues to encourage younger people and families to become involved with church life to secure its future. Anyone wishing to serve on the PCC needs to apply to join the electoral roll, membership of which is being reviewed shortly. Although Rev Neil lives in Sibford Gower, his pastoral care extends to everyone in the Wykham Benefice, not just church goers, and visits can be arranged if needed.

Excluding maintenance costs and charitable donations, it costs about £250 per week to keep St Martin's Church open for all to use. This includes about £8000 per annum for the cost of ministry and £2000 per annum for the church building insurance. Thanks to the generosity of our congregation, who cover the cost of ministry, other fund raising and donations, all 2022 costs have been covered. A total of £1250 has been given to good causes in the past year from specific fund raising and collections including £160 to The Children's Society from collections in Advent. Additional income came from a large collection at Tim Rootes and Oswald Waller's memorial service, wedding fees and the Village Festival. The Church Annual Report and Accounts are being prepared and will be published at the annual meeting and online in due course.


The PCC meets on 24th January to discuss activities during 2022 and prepare for the Annual Parochial Church Meeting, which will be held before the end of April. Items on the agenda include Lent and Easter Plans – our Lent Lunch will be on 27th February, finance and fund raising and church maintenance. There is a need to upgrade electrics in church including the lighting, in addition to repairs to plasterwork and redecorating. A safety barrier needs to be installed by the church steps once planning permission is obtained, plus replacement of hedges and some fencing and a boardwalk to receive the steps installed by the village hall committee, giving access to and from the church

Shutford Parish Council Meeting

Wednesday 11th January 2022 at 7.30pm in the Village Hall The meeting commenced at 7.30pm

Present: Cllrs: Helen Nixseaman (Chair), Ashley Taylor, George Reynolds, Stephen Barnes, Paul Huewen, Lynne Parsons and David Best, Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer. Three members of the public attended the meeting.

22/056	Apologies for Absence: Cllr Chris Halle
22/057	Declarations of Interest: None
22/058	Minutes of the last meeting: It was RESOLVED that the minutes of the meeting held on 5th October 2022 were a correct record (unanimous) and signed by the Chairman.
	NOTE: It was subsequently noted that an item was omitted from 9th November's minutes concerning the precept for 2023/24. It had been agreed that the precept would remain unchanged for the coming financial year.
22/059	Matters arising from the minutes: The action list was reviewed.
22/059/1	Playground Inspection – Cllr Helen Nixseaman had sent the playground inspection report to Trevor for him to respond on the rot to some of the posts.
22/059/2	Tyte Pond Bench and Posts - A post has been sourced and fitted shortly. The Queen Elizabeth II memorial seat has been delivered but on assembling it was found that one on the holes is in the wrong place. A response is awaited from the manufacturer.
22/059/3	Trees on the Dairyground – The clerk will contact Kai O'Hanlon to get the crowns lifted on trees above the play equipment.
22/060	Parish Matters:
22/060/1	Victoria Prentis Digital Connectivity Survey – It was agreed that Cllr Ashley Taylor would complete this and details will be communicated to residents who may also wish to complete it. Details can be found at https://www.victoriaprentis.com/ digital-connectivity
22/060/2	OCC Councillor Priority Grant Application – It was agreed that the clerk would complete the application for the Queen Elizabeth II Memorial bench,
22/060/3	20mph Speed Limit – Feedback from residents had been welcomed and it was decided not to proceed with speed bumps at this time. It was also agreed that the clerk would register Shutford for the 20mph speed limit in place of the 30mph limit but consultation with residents would continue as implementation would not be for several years if the final decision is to proceed.
22/060/4	Rat Infestation – There appears to be a Rat infestation in parts of the village, particularly Lower End. Residents are reminded that bird feeding can aggravate the situation as bird food on the ground or dropping from feeders attracts rats. Residents should either seek professional help and advice from a pest control company or put down recommended and approved baited traps designed for the task, care should always be taken when handling or placing baited boxes to ensure the Health & Safety of yourself, others and wildlife and at no time should any poison be placed outside of a baited box. Rod Court has offered to advise residents if needed and can be contacted on 01295 788277.
22/060/5	Meeting with new Owner of the Industrial Estate – Two Councillors had a very positive meeting with the new owner who explained that he was interested in tidying it up and attracting artisan businesses. There are no plans to develop the site.

22/061	Finance:
22/061/1	Accounts – The accounts and bank reconciliation were circulated prior to the meeting.
22/061/2	Bank Balances – The bank balances on 3rd January were £16,470.00.
22/061/3	Interest Rates – The clerk provided details of an alternative savings account with a higher rate of interest than Barclays. Funds are protected up to £85,000 by the Government FSCS scheme. Alternative accounts to Barclays will be considered.
22/062	Correspondence:
22/060/1	Stone protruding from bank along the High Street – This has been reported to OCC Highways who will investigate. The owner of a building close to the location had written to the PC expressing concern that any work may cause damage to the building. It is believed that OCC Highways would not carry out any work that might damage a building.
22/060/2	Planning Application 22/02411/F for Shepherds Hut at Slatters Barn – The applicant had written to the PC expressing concern at the length of time the application was taking. The PC has no control over the determination of the application which is the responsibility of Cherwell District Council.
22/063	Planning: There have been no new residential applications or decisions since the last meeting on 9th November 2022.
22/063/1	22/03794/TEL – Residents should be aware of an application by Voneus for 20 telegraph poles to carry broadband fibre cables (5 on the Epwell Rd, 1 on The Green and 14 on the road to Fiveways. The PC has not been consulted on this and applications like this are generally approved as they are considered essential infrastructure
22/064	Any Other Business:
22/064/1	Sympathies to the family and friends of Richard Doxford – Councillors were shocked at the death of Richard Doxford before Christmas and would like to express their sympathies to his family and friends. Their thoughts remain with them.
22/064/2	Christmas Card to residents from Ligia – Councillors and residents were touched by the Christmas Card that Ligia sent out. This must have been a sad and difficult time for Ligia after the recent loss of her father.
22/064/3	Traffic coming in and out of West Street – Residents have asked if a mirror could be placed at the junction to assist drivers turning in off the High Street. OCC Highways do not encourage or install mirrors. Residents are asked to park with care at this junction and take care turning in and out.
22/064/4	Christmas tree at Jaime Corner – The PC will consider putting a Christmas Tree up at Jaime Corner this year.
22/064/5	Celebrations to mark the Coronation of King Charles III – The PC is considering organising a picnic on the Dairyground on Sunday 7th May, the day after the coronation.
