Notes of the Parish Council Meeting held on 12 July 2017

We welcomed one member of the public as well as Cllr. George Reynolds.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on Wednesday 13 September 2017.

The meeting will start at 7.30p.m in the village hall.

Thereafter meetings will be held on the second Wednesday every other month in the village hall

Parish councillors would welcome more villagers at these meetings to participate in the democratic process.

HIGHWAYS: Frustration with the pot holes, their lack of repair and the apparent lack of speed with which the highways department at the County Council works continues. The clerk's perseverance in writing to the Council is admirable. There are at least markings on the road that indicate some repair work may be imminent. SPEED CHECK: The data from the temporary speed camera purchased by the Parish Council was sent to the police and the Road and Safety officer at Oxfordshire County Council both of whom confirmed the analysis made by the Parish Council. We are aware that data collected at other times including volume of traffic will vary if collected at other times. Parish Councillors are mindful that speed is a problem on occasions and want to try to take action to ameliorate this. We have agreed to purchase several "Twentys Plenty" signs to be erected at entrances/exits to the village. We also intend to ask the Road and Safety officer at

OCC to come to the village and carry out a technical assessment. He has already told us that any traffic calming measures that are installed have to be financed by the Parish Council and could cost anywhere between £5 - 7K. His technical assessment is no guarantee that traffic calming will be installed but his advice will be useful in informing further action if necessary.

ALLOTMENTS: We now have five residents on the waiting list who would very much like to rent and cultivate an allotment. Some have been waiting for some time. All the allotments have now been inspected and councillors will continue to monitor them on a regular basis. Councillors are clear that allotments that are not cultivated cannot be held when there are others who wish to use them. Allotment rents are due in September and we have decided that where an allotment has not been cultivated to any degree then the allotment holder will be told that they need to share their allotment with those on the waiting list. If, however, you are willing to share your allotment now then please let us know by contacting the Clerk to the PC.

DAIRYGROUND: Hurrah! The PC will be purchasing a new see saw for Dairyground and it will be erected as soon as possible. Usual safety warning re the see saw in place at the moment.

DE-FIB: This is now in place. Cllr. Helen Gibbs is the lead councillor responsible for this equipment and will be organising training for its use shortly. **Cllr. Gibbs is keen to hear from any volunteers who would like to be trained and help with checking the de-fib.** Email: helengibbs84@hotmail.co.uk or telephone.

Please also note the following:

Alison Hughes Roselawn Ivy Lane. I am the NHS Community First Responder for Shutford. I also carry a defibrillator along with oxygen and am fully trained as back up for certain conditions if someone dials 999.

ROAD CLOSURES: Some villagers may be aware that there are two road closures either end of the village; one starting on 24 July lasting one month between Shutford and North Newington and from Five Turns to unnamed road to Broughton. The other starting on 7 August lasting one month on the Epwell Road. This is clearly going to cause some inconvenience. The clerk is contacting Thames Water to clarify this situation and any changes to this will be posted on the village notice boards.

This year's Christian Aid Week was $14^{th} - 20^{th}$ May - £555 has been given to this important charity from the door to door collection and donations. So far, this year villagers have raised £1265 for good causes.

A Beetle Drive was held in church on 27th May. 25 people attended to enjoy an hour or so of fun and refreshments. There was lots of chocolate to be had also. The next Beetle Drive will be in the autumn.

Members of the PCC ran the cake stall at the Shutford Festival and provided tea and other refreshments. It was a beautiful hot, sunny afternoon so tea was less popular than in previous years. The day was a great financial and social success and we are grateful to Rita Livesey for organising the festival again this year. £3000 has been received by the church and this money will be used to pay the annual building insurance premium and the cost of repairs to the font and some electrical work. This money helps with the need to have £250 income each week to cover the cost of ministry and the church upkeep.

We are sad to report the death of Edie Turner whose funeral was held on 24th May. Mrs Turner lived on The Green all her adult life and was a great supporter of church fund raising and other village social events. We offer our condolences to her family and friends.

We are pleased to welcome Lily Jane Staite-Loveridge as a member of the church as she was baptised on 17th June. She was supported by her family and friends. Lily is the granddaughter of Clive and Gill Evans.

We have received a gift of a new lectern bible from Susan Marshall the sister of the late Dr Michael Aldous who died in February. This bible contains modern translations of all the readings used each Sunday.

John Hodgkins and Ken Jeffs were sworn in as churchwarden's in Charlbury Church on 11th July. This annual service was led by the Archdeacon of Dorchester, The Venerable Judy French.

The Wykeham Benefice council met in St Martin's Church on 12th July with news from all the parishes including finances, special church services and social events. The meeting considered "What sort of church do we want to be"? There are lots of good things happening in our parishes and we will adapt and try to be relevant to people of all ages, denominations or none. Communication is important with The Benefice News and Weekly Pewsheet and Benefice website used to update everyone. Social media may be needed to reach younger folk?

The Deddington Deanery Pilgrimage visited all parishes in the benefice on 20th and 21st July: Morning Prayer was held in Shutford on 21st.

This year's Oxfordshire Historic Churches Trust Ride and Stride is on Saturday, 9th September. We have not raised money for St Martin's Church through this initiative for many years so we are hopeful to get a team of riders this year. Sponsorship forms will be available from KJJ.

This year's Harvest Thanksgiving is on 24th September with a Supper on Monday 25th in the village hall. Keep this evening free.

Congratulations to Shutford Village Hall Committee for the opening of the new hall on 14th July and to all the many sponsors, donors and workers for making the dream a reality. Well done: we look forward to using the hall again for our meetings and social and fundraising events.







News from the Bottom

It has been some time since the activities and movements in the Bottom have featured in the Shutford News. For new readers it is perhaps important to explain that the three dwellings on the single track road from five ways to Wroxton, Beggars Barn, Wroxton Mill and Maidenhill form the region known as Wroxton Bottom, colloquially known as 'The Bottom'. Technically the Bottom is an area straddling the parishes of both Shutford and Wroxton but a petition to the House of Lords to declare the Bottom an independent entity is working its way through the constitutional system. Meantime the Bottom is enacting a number of measures to establish its independence.

The reason for this update into the affairs of the Bottom is to mark the occasion recently when the self elected Mayor of the Bottom, Jim Perry, made a state visit to what still, he fantasises, is his fiefdom. Readers will recall that the Mayor sold the mayoral seat, Wroxton Mill, to Mark and Fiona Burges Watson a couple of years ago whilst at the same time retaining a few acres of Mill land. This retention of land does, in the Mayor's view, entitle him to remain in post; this he has done despite the Alderman's attempts to unearth historic statutes to declare the Mayor to be illegally in post. This painstaking research has now conclusively established that for over a hundred years the office of Mayor has by statute always been held by the owner of Wroxton Mill. This statute has of course been challenged by the current Mayor and the matter will be heard in court at the Maidenhill Sessions in September presided over by the Lord May. The Bottom will be represented by the eminent constitutional lawyers Juncker and May; Mr Perry has retained Floggitt and Scarper to present his case. At a preliminary court hearing the current Mayor failed to attend. Apparently he is now very aware of the importance of preserving his public image and consequently is not prepared to travel in the same car as his chauffeur. Our reporter asked Mr Perry for his comments, but he was unavailable. Mrs Perry said that she had not spoken to her husband for three months. Asked whether Jim had been away from home Mrs Perry said that he had in fact been at home but that she just didn't want to interrupt him!

Anyway, despite all this, the mayoral visit took place with the Mayor graciously calling upon the Alderman at Beggars Barn, the Lord May at Maidenhill and Mark and Fiona at Wroxton Mill. The customary tithes were presented to the Mayor, although the Burges Watsons were somewhat taken

aback to realise that it was customary for new residents to hand over to the Mayor the entire contents of their wine cellar as a mark of respect.

The visit included the inspection of potholes with the Mayor giving technical advice upon how they could be enlarged in order to deter traffic from driving through the Bottom. The proposals to install toll gates at both the five ways and Stratford Rd ends of the single track road are likely to receive both planning and highways approval within the near future.

This being a momentous day, the full administrative and state resources of the Bottom were on parade. The combined police/ militia paraded under the command of 'Nick of the Nick Elton' who had taken measures to ensure full security for the mayoral party and guests with snipers carefully concealed as potholes, the Sopwith Camel aloft with Winco Lawrance and the submarine submerged but ready for action on the Soar bottom.

Other items of news. Regular readers of the Shutford News will be interested to know that the F1 Grand Prix circuit has been approved by the planning authorities. The track will start on the golf course (by kind permission of the Burges Watsons), cross the road opposite Maidenhill, before looping round Beggars Barn on its way to the grandstand at what used to be the George and Dragon (great viewing position but sadly no food available) and finally dropping down from five ways to the start/finish near the cess pit on the golf course. It has been decided to give names to many parts of the circuit and so far Perry Straight, Alfie Corner, Charlie Chicane and Bottom Tunnel have been approved. Anyone wishing to suggest a name for part of the circuit should send it to the Mayor with a personal cheque. Priority will be given to the biggest cheques!

Further news from the Bottom is that the campaign to secede from the current UK rule, BOTOXIT, is gathering pace and a referendum of Bottom inhabitants is to be held in August. The Mayor intends to announce the result at least a week before polling day so that voters can be fully informed before entering the polling booths entry to which has been reduced to £30 (family discounts available).

The Mayor and The Alderman hope that readers will value and enjoy news from the Bottom. With the permission of the editor(doesn't she do a great job!) there will be further updates upon movements in the Bottom in future editions of Shutford News.

The Supper Circle, would like to thank all that turned out to watch the Cookery demonstration at the recent festival in Shutford. For all of those that have asked for the Caribbean goat recipe, here it is

Jamaican Goat Curry

4lbs diced goat

1 teaspoon black pepper

1 teaspoon salt

4 large potatoes diced

1 large red onion

2 tablespoons minced garlic

1 tablespoon thyme chopped

1 bunch of spring onion tops chopped

1 scotch bonnet finely chopped

2 tablespoons of Jamaican curry powder

1 teaspoon of all spice

Veg oil

- Fry the diced onion and potato in a little oil, in an oven proof pan until tender.
- Remove from the pan
- Add a splash of oil to the pan the onions were in, and fry the diced goat until browned.
- Add the onions and potato to the pan with all the other ingredients.
- Give it a good stir together
- Then place in the oven, 180 degrees, with the lid on for about an hour until the goat is tender. You may want to add a splash of water, but it does not need this.

Serve with some rice, delicious! Goat can be bought from any good butchers, we got ours from Wykham Park farm shop, and if you don't want the curry to be too hot swap the birds eye chilli for one of your liking.


