Dairyground Play Equipment update

What has been done so far:

The old swings have now all been replaced and in the last few weeks work has also been carried out to tidy up the trees and shrubs, and sow new grass seed in the area where the old flat swings were located. We hope you will agree that the area is looking pretty good.

What will happen next:

The next stage of the project is to install the wooden multi-activity play unit. We have listened to Dairyground residents' comments and have decided to position the new equipment under the trees, going round the existing climbing frame, which a number of families wanted to keep.



We will be repositioning the

see-saw to near where the existing balance beams are located. The beams will be removed as we will have beams and much more with the new multi-activity unit. The area under the new unit and climbing frame will be resurfaced.

We are also planning to replace the old goal post with a new one. This work should be carried out over the next few months.

Funding:

The funding we have received so far, from the Lottery, Cherwell, the Parish Council, donations and fund raising is sufficient to cover the costs to get us to this point. However, if we can generate more funds we can consider further work and/or reduce the Parish Council contribution, allowing the council to do other things for the village.

We are planning to hold a fun Horse Race Night on **Friday 11**th **October** in the Village Hall to raise some more funds. Please save the date!

After that:

Once the multi-activity unit has been installed we will meet with residents and families again to consider whether we want to do any further work. This will be dependent on funding. Things we will consider are likely to include landscaping, seating, any further play equipment, a new notice board and possibly more to attract wildlife. However, anything more that we do will depend on the views of villagers and the level of funding we have. We can also do things in stages.



There were 6 children and 12 adults supporting them at Messy Church on 15th June. This session celebrated summertime and Father's Day. Those who attend enjoy the experience particularly the refreshments. The next one is on 21st September: it's free of charge, so do come.

A church team organised and served teas and cakes at the Village Festival on 22nd June. As usual all the refreshments were made and donated, mainly by church members, so we are grateful to everyone for their time and generosity. £471 was raised part of a total Festival profit of more than £5000. Special thanks to Rita Livesey for organising the festival again this year. The church will use any money given to them to pay the annual insurance premium of £2016.

The church is open everyday for all to use for some quiet time with worship Saturday and Sunday Mornings. Although attendance remains stable, the PCC as part of the Deddington Deanery, will be looking closely at the challenges the church faces. With fewer younger people attending or wanting to be involved with church the future is uncertain. One of our local challenges will be finding a new vicar, as the Reverend Ronald Hawkes retires and moves to Yorkshire in January 2020.

19/012	Minutes of the last meeting: It was PROPOSED & RESOLVED that the minutes of the meeting held on 8 th May 2019 were a correct record and signed. Proposed by Cllr H.Nixseaman, Seconded by Cllr T.Parish.

BUSES and COMMUNITY

We are delighted to have our former bus back. After one month, usage is encouraging. The last week in June saw six passengers on Monday and six again on Wednesday and some on other days of the week. It is a real pleasure to see the countryside and not have to worry about traffic or parking and with a bus pass...free! Some passengers (including fare-paying) have used it to get to the station or connecting coach and bus services- saving rail parking costs of £7.50 a day! Or £30 for two taxis.

As a passenger you realise just how many cars there are now in Banbury. The 'green' argument says buses reduce congestion and pollution. It is not the answer to every need but someone needing things from Marks or Boots took the bus in and was met later by car for normal supermarket shopping.

The drivers are very good and helpful. One North Newington passenger is dropped at her door on her way home! The bus has stopped at "Fiveways" for a passenger needing to walk to Balscote. They have also dropped people off and picked them up at normal bus stops in town. The normal first stop is the old Post Office but some of us have alighted at the stop near Matalan carpark.

Every Saturday there is an afternoon bus at 3.16pm to Banbury. It returns from town centre at 4.10pm, that gives almost 40 minutes there for something urgent or buying end-of-day fruit and veg. on the market at half-price! But it also means that going *on Saturdays on the morning bus (11.26am) and back on the later bus* gives even more time in Banbury or Gateway or both.

We arranged with Johnsons to extend the old route to the Gateway shopping estate. One passenger went in on the morning bus which waits 20 minutes there, changed something in a shop, and caught that bus back into the town centre, returning on our normal No. 6 (1.50pm town centre).

With bus passes one can get back into town using Stagecoach buses as well. Johnson's paying fares are cheaper than Stagecoach. Mixing time at Gateway and in the town centre is very possible.

That second bus every Saturday also means possible visits to Stratford. The 10.47am from Shutford to Stratford reaches Stratford at 11.53am but not easy to get back most days, but on Saturday that second bus via Shutford (the 3.16pm mentioned above) means a bus back from Stratford exists giving just over two hours in Stratford. Only on a Saturday, but also, as explained, Monday to Friday in those school holidays.

We approached Johnsons and their bus manager, started there only in September, was very keen to help villages. But Warwickshire subsidise rural buses. We lost ours when Oxfordshire dropped subsidies and Warwickshire insisted our bus go through Shenington- a quicker route to Banbury. He persuaded them switching back to Shutford was good service and could pick up more passengers as Shenington had both 6 and 7 buses and was still Oxfordshire!

It meant real goodwill to us and hard work for him <u>and we will lose it</u> <u>again if we don't use it</u>.

It really is a worthwhile service for those who need it so as a community let's try to make best use of it.




Shutford Book Club

The Shutford Book Club meets on the last Monday of each month in Shutford Village Hall 7:30 pm.



Shutford Festival 2019: Village Survey Feedback

Thank you to everyone who completed the recent village survey. Below is a summary of the 24 responses who provided feedback

with comments on the feedback.

Most people heard of the festival via through the Shutford News - great to hear!!

Q: What did you like most about this year's festival?

A: Responses included:
"Weather and Evening Do";
"Community Feeling"; The
atmosphere and large space
to move around in"; "The
Bands"; "Friendly vibe";
"Great atmosphere of a
village coming together to



have fun"; "The stalls the village had as well as the archery and pottery"; "The



Encore dancers are always good. Nice to have some different stands like the Animals of the World and the Beekeepers"; "The whole festival day and night amazing atmosphere"; "I especially enjoyed the archery, plant stall, teas and the wine and water stall"; "Toilets being in two areas, seating in the bar area".

Festival comment: Sounds like we are doing the right thing.

Q: If you purchased food from the BBQ, what did you think of the food?

A: "Thought it was really good. Good to have the skinny version. Reasonable value and tasted

great"; "Very good"; "Excellent food, a bit pricey"; "Burgers were lovely"; "Very high quality and nice service; value for money"; "More veggie options"; "Excellent food, a bit pricey".

Festival comment: For the past four years the BBQ has been run by the village from 12:30 pm–10:00 pm. With one person cooking and 4/6 people helping throughout the day (rota basis). This year we took the decision that we could no longer sustain this. So we decided to bring in an outside caterer, who would agree to a % donation of their takings, provide high quality farm food & have the appropriate food hygiene licence in place. After various options researched, we chose Happy Herefords. If we go with this option again, we will ask them to look at their pricing & to provide more veggie.

Q: What did you think of the daytime activities?

A: "Lots to watch and participate";
"Good range"; "Would like to see
more traditional "fete" things and
we should bring back the bric-abrac"; "All good. Nice having
Juggling John round doing tricks
etc."; "Could expand maybe some
fete games, eg skittles, table
skittles, coconut shy etc"; "Village



games, welly throwing, tug of war, three-legged, egg n spoon etc.";

Q: Is there anything else you would like to see during the daytime?

A: "More children specific stalls"; "A falconry display"; "Zorbing. Ball pit for adults and children maybe"; "More traditional fete stalls"; "Brass band"; "Big personality to commentate"; "Live bands, morris dancers"; "Stalls for local organisations, eg Scouts, Rotarians etc"

Festival comment: It would be super to introduce some traditional fete games, the challenges we face each year are resources to run these types of stalls. Volunteers to run these stalls, please step forward! Please also bear in mind we have a very tight budget for the daytime activities, and this does prevent us from booking extra activities such as bands, falconry (costs £350) etc. The past 2 years we have invited Radio Horton from Horton Hospital who do an amazing job, commentating as well as providing background music all for £100!! We feel it's a good way of putting something back into the

community too. A suggestion was made to bring back the 'Bric A Brac' – let's discuss at the feedback meeting in October.

Q: If you attended the evening event what did you think of the bands?



A: "Really good, great to dance to"; Excellent the best so far"

Q: Are there any bands you would like to see?

A: "Rolling Stones"; "Abba tribute"; "Definitely the 2nd band again".

Festival comment: We would love to book the Rolling Stones, anyone got a contact?? However, joking aside, does anyone have any contacts of any famous bands

please let us know? Please also remember we are extremely grateful to our current sponsors who provide the resources to enable us to book bands.

Q: Do you have any recommendations or suggestions for next year's festival?


A: "Better food options in the evening. Maybe a fish and chip van and a pizza van alongside the burgers"; "Horse rides around the field"; "Keep up the fantastic work, love the vintage vehicles"; "Too many commercial stalls not sure it brings in people from outside of Shutford".

Festival comment: When you bring in outside caterers, they need to be given an estimate of what they could earn over the course of the day and evening. If there are too many options, the caterers won't make enough to make it profitable for them to attend. Hence this year we limited this to the BBQ. However, let's discuss this at the feedback meeting.

So again, thank you for all your feedback, we hope this gives you an insight into the logistics of how the festival comes together. We would love more people to get involved with the festival. We have our Festival Debrief meeting on **Tuesday 1 October from 7:00 pm**. Please come along to not only share your ideas but of course volunteer for next year's festival on **20 June 2020!!**






