Dairyground Play Equipment update

Exciting News!

If you have walked past the Dairyground recently you will have seen that work has started on installing the new Multi Activity Play Unit.

This is the most exciting piece of new equipment and will be located under the trees, around the existing climbing frame. The unit will take a few weeks to install so unfortunately it won't be possible to go into that area of the Dairyground for a little while, but when it's done we're sure that it will be fantastic!





The new new goalpost has already been installed and is being enjoyed by would-be Harry Kane's.

What's next

The see-saw will be moved to near where the existing balance beams are located. The beams will be removed as we will have beams and much more with the new multi-activity unit. The area under the new unit and climbing frame is being resurfaced.

Once everything is in place we will have a good look (with families and residents) and decide whether we would like to do anything else, such as replace the old notice board, install any more seating or play equipment or carry out landscaping. This will depend on funding.

Funding

We have received donations from the Village Hall, and various residents, in addition to funding received from the Lottery, Cherwell, and the Parish Council. We are very grateful for all of these contributions and are in a good place to complete work planned so far. Anything more that we receive will either fund more work on the Dairyground or allow the Parish Council to do other work in the village.

The Race Night on Friday 11th October in the Village Hall is looking very popular, with lots of villagers planning to come along. We hope that this will be great fun and will enable us to raise more funds.

National Portrait Gallery partnership exhibition comes to Upton House and Gardens

From 21 September – 9 December 2019, visitors will be able to see "Faces of Change: Nature's Champions" at National Trust property Upton House and Gardens

Faces of Change 'Nature's Champions' is a partnership between the National Trust and the National Portrait Gallery drawing on portraits from the Gallery's Collection. It focuses on individuals who have transformed the way we perceive, experience, and aim to protect the natural world.

Featured sitters include environmental activists, scientists, poets, politicians, campaigners, gardeners and broadcasters who have affected how we interact with our environment. The exhibition includes outstanding paintings, sculptures, photographs and recent commissions.

From broadcaster Sir David Attenborough, to the author of My Family and

Other Animals, Gerald Durrell, visitors will have the chance to get up close and personal with the faces of those who've shaped the world we live in and discover their green legacy.

Other champions featured in the exhibition include Gardeners' World presenter Roy Lancaster, who travelled the world on plant-finding expeditions, and environmentalist and champion of organic farming and gardening, Prince Charles.

A painting of one of the founders of the National Trust, Octavia Hill, will



also be on display along with a portrait of children's writer, artist and conservationist Beatrix Potter. Other recognisable faces include: Dame Vivienne Westwood and The Clash front man, Joe Strummer.

To complement the exhibition, the house team will also be highlighting landscape paintings from 2^{nd} Viscount Bearsted's extensive collection in the 'picture in focus' display in the sitting room. This display will allow visitors to explore how artists' vision of the natural world has changed over time.

Annie Reilly, Acting Head of Public Programmes at the National Trust comments:

"For many years, we have enjoyed a successful partnership with the National Portrait Gallery showcasing portraits from their collection to visitors at Trust places. Last year saw the development of this partnership with a touring exhibition to commemorate the women's suffrage anniversary, which was the start of our Faces of Change series of exhibitions."

Rab MacGibbon, Curator, 17th & 18th Centuries Collections, National Portrait Gallery adds:

"We're delighted to continue to partner with the National Trust on the Faces of Change exhibitions and to be able to bring our Collection to three new National Trust places, this time to celebrate the champions of the natural world. This exhibition is a call to arms for nature. Come and be inspired by coming face to face with key figures from the environmental movement. We can't all be a Jane Goodall or David Attenborough, but we can ask ourselves what actions we are taking in our daily lives to help protect the planet for the benefit of all its inhabitants and for future generations. We can all be Nature Champions!"

The exhibition will be available to view in the squash court from 21 September – 9 December during opening hours. Upton House and Gardens is open 11am-5pm (last entry 4pm) every day until Monday 4 November. From Monday 4 November, the property is open Friday – Monday, 12-4pm (last entry 3pm).

The PCC met early July and discussed finance, churchyard maintenance, safeguarding, benefice and deanery activities and fund raising. There are various training courses planned for the autumn including an Eco-Church workshop on 7th October in Sibford.

Later in the month the Benefice Council met in Swalcliffe Church when each parish reported on worship numbers, social gatherings and fund raising. An area conference is planned for November when the Bishop of Dorchester will lead discussion about the Common Vision of our towns and villages becoming a more Christ-like Church. Over the coming months there will be various groups looking at different kinds of ministry, new churches, congregations with an emphasis on youth, schools, the environment and communities. With congregations dwindling new styles of worship and outreach will be tried with time, days and location of organised services changed. Any thoughts?

A Summer Soccer School was held at Bishop Carpenter School, 31st July until 3rd August: up to 40 youngsters took part and we are grateful to Rob and his team for organising the event. Also, to many others who helped in various ways including the provision of food for the coaches.

The Community Lunch in August hosted by Ronald & Elisabeth raised £115 for the church. The next church led ones will be on 17th October and 5th December: these eat and greet lunches are a social success.

Ladies on the flower rota continue to supply and arrange flowers on a weekly basis with those on the cleaning rota keeping the church neat and tidy. The church grass has been cut regularly and with the summer flowers now faded the long grass has been removed. A third brood of swallows have hatched in the church porch. A few maintenance jobs have been done including a small electrical appliances check.

An inspection of church records, inventory and logbooks took place in August. We are due for a full inspection of the building in 2020.

The church is open everyday for all to use for some quiet time with worship Saturday and Sunday Mornings. Worship continued over the summer at a gentle pace with some thought provoking talks and of course some rousing hymns (some breath-taking) with music provided by our electronic organ either live or recorded. The choir and others came to our Benefice service on 1st September quadrupling our usual congregation. Refreshments were served in church after the service.

We had 15 visitors taking part in the annual Oxfordshire Historic Churches Trust Ride and Stride on 14th September. Volunteers were in church all day to welcome them, with the G & D pub providing toilet facilities. As far as we are aware, no funds were raised for St Martin's church this year.

Harvest Festivals will be held across the benefice during September and October with suppers at various times and locations. Money raised in Shutford will be given to Katharine House Hospice.

Looking forward, there will be a door to door collection for the Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal in the two weeks prior to Remembrance Sunday on 10th November. Our service will return to its 6.00pm slot with music provided by Deddington Brass. A retiring collection will be given to the Poppy Appeal.

There will be a Beetle Drive on 16th November at 4.00pm.

The PCC will meet again during the autumn to discuss end of year events including Advent and Christmas. Traditional carol services will be held across the benefice so we may do something different in Shutford this year. Please contact KJJ with any thoughts or requests. Messy Church on 14th December will have a Christmas theme with Christingles. Do we want Christmas Carol singing around the village?

19/019	Apologies for Absence: Cllr Tom Parrish
19/020	Declarations of Interest: None raised.
19/021	Minutes of the last meeting: It was RESOLVED that the minutes of the meeting held on 10 th July 2019 were a correct record and signed. Proposed by Cllr H.Nixseaman, Seconded by Cllr D. Pitt
19/022	Matters arising from the minutes: J Yeoman's Bench – A Sabin has agreed to strengthen the back of the bench. Tree in Church Lane – This has been taken down and the wood sold. Sapling Trees – These are not looking very healthy. Defibrillators Pads – The new pads have been installed.
19/023	Parish Matters:
19/023/1	Dairyground Update – The Multi Activity play equipment is currently being installed and the area is fenced off. The Village Hall Committee has generously donated £1,000 to the new play equipment. Sufficient funding has been received for the Multi Activity. It was agreed that the contractor would be asked to chop off the excess wood at the top of the swings. It was also agreed that no further play equipment would be ordered at this stage. It was agreed that the noticeboard should be replaced.
19/023/2	Allotment Update – Another plot has been rented on the bank behind one of the new houses in lvy Lane. Overgrown plots have been rotavated. New allotment contracts have been received from all but one of the current allotment holders.
19/023/3	Village Orchard – Broughton Castle Estate has confirmed to Cllr D Pitt that they will not permit fruit trees to be planted on the allotment land on the bank above Lower End. Some of this land is overgrown. Not much of the land would be suitable for grazing. Other uses for the land will be considered by the Parish Council.
19/023/4	Ownership of Land by Plush Stone – Cllr.G.Reynolds has investigated ownership and it does not appear to be included in the Title Deeds plan for the industrial estate or garages that back onto it. It is believed that there is no owner and that the vegetation can be pruned.
19/023/5 19/023/6	Tree Maintenance – It was agreed to increase the budget for tree maintenance for 2010-21. Subsidence in road on lvy Lane – although this was reported on fix my street it was agreed that the clerk will report this to Thames Water
19/023/7	Chimney and weekend working on the Industrial Estate – The owner of 944 Restorations Ltd has advised that he was advised that no planning permission was required for the installation of the paint spray booth. Cllr G Reynolds will check with Cherwell District Council Planning. There is no restriction to weekend working on the lease, but the owner has given an assurance that they will take steps to minimise any noise at the weekend. The owner has also advised that none of the neighbouring residents have reported any issues to him and that he has assisted them with flat batteries etc The owner is intending to attend a future meeting but could not attend this one due to a prior commitment






Shutford Book Club






