



# A Step Forward.....




Despite the challenges of Covid, our Village Hall step project has moved closer to delivery day. Blacksmiths FC Harriss have been working hard to construct the new steel staircase at their workshop in Burford. A visit in October to review progress provided a glimpse of the main staircase structure and landings in progress.

Handrails and balustrades are expected to be nearing completion with delivery expected before the end of the

year.

The step project was envisaged when the new hall received planning consent some four years ago. With village support and Lottery funding, the steps will reinstate an earlier direct route to the Church and enable direct access both between buildings. We plan to have the steps in place for 2021.





The Shutford Book Club normally meets on the last Monday of each month in Shutford Village Hall 7:30 pm. During Lockdown this is being done virtually.



The annual Oxfordshire Historic Churches Ride and Stride was held on 12<sup>th</sup> September. Although the church was closed, refreshments were available in the church porch and in the George and Dragon. There were 8 visitors but no participants from Shutford, although £30 has been collected for the charity.

Church services started again in September after 5 months but sadly have had to be cancelled again for November. Benefice services via Zoom have reverted to 10.00am each Sunday from the 5.00pm slot during September and October: these services will probably continue until the new year at least, as many of our worshippers are in a vulnerable age group. Most of our benefice churches, however, are open for individual prayers at sometime each week with St Martin's Church open from 10.00am until dusk each Sunday.

It was good to be back in church although face coverings must be worn, and social distancing observed. There are changes in the way communion is delivered with no sharing of the chalice. Hymns recorded by St Martin's Singers (in the Fields not Shutford) are used, as no singing is allowed. Despite restrictions, our core congregation has returned although there were only 6 at our Harvest Thanksgiving. The church was beautifully decorated with flowers and some produce, fruit, and vegetables: the non-perishable goods were given to the BYHP Foodbank in Banbury with donations received for vegetables.

Our planned 6.00pm Remembrance Service on 8<sup>th</sup> November was cancelled but the church was open, and at 9.30am a short service of Remembrance was held at the Roll of Honour by the churchwarden alone. 2 minutes silence was observed, and a wreath from the PCC and congregation was laid.

At 10.00am a benefice service was held via Zoom and those who lost their lives in two world wars were remembered. More than 50 people, socially distanced, assembled near the village war memorial to witness an Act of Remembrance and two minutes silence at 11.00am led by Alasdair Gibbs.



Wreaths were laid on behalf of The Royal British Legion and Shutford Parish Council. Julie Jakeman played The Last Post and Reveille. The church tower was illuminated on Remembrance Sunday and Armistice Day, 11<sup>th</sup> November (St Martin's Day) when a second Act of Remembrance was held at 11.00am at the war memorial. There was no door to door collection or service for the Royal British Legion this year but collecting boxes were in The George and Dragon and elsewhere, and donations can be made at <a href="https://www.poppyshop.org.uk">www.poppyshop.org.uk</a>.

Advent Sunday is 29<sup>th</sup> November when there will be an online benefice service at 10.00am. It is hoped, if coronavirus restrictions are relaxed, that we will be able to have Sunday services in the church in the run up to Christmas.

The Church of England is planning an online National Christingle Event with The Children's Society on 13<sup>th</sup> December: see C of E website online services. Shutford's carol service is to be on Sunday, 20<sup>th</sup> December at 4.30pm but sadly, as things stand, there can be no singing or our usual seasonal refreshments. Family Communion for Christmas Day will be at 9.30am.

It has been a difficult year for everyone due to the coronavirus with the cancellation of church services and most fund raising, meaning a 30% reduction in income as at the end of September. Our loyal congregation have continued to support the church financially enabling us to pay our major bills, particularly the parish share of £7500 to the Oxford Diocese, which covers the cost of parish priests' stipends.

However, we will be unable to donate to charity this year and may have to use reserves to pay the church building insurance of £2000 which, in the past, has been funded by church fetes and latterly the village festival.

The Illuminate and Celebrate Initiative brings in a steady income, and other donations will be gratefully received.

Apart from grants for specific building projects the church is not usually eligible for help to cover day to day costs. It is the responsibility of the PCC, with the help of the church congregation and the wider community, to raise funds accordingly.



Revd Neil Bowler

We are pleased to announce that the Revd Neil Bowler has been appointed as rector of the Wykeham Benefice. Neil grew up in a mining community in South Yorkshire and qualified as a solicitor working for 10 years as a legal advisor to magistrate's courts there.

He then trained for the priesthood and was ordained in 2005.

He served in various roles in the Sheffield Diocese and moves to Sibford Gower in January.

He will be installed as rector by The Bishop of Oxford in Broughton on 5<sup>th</sup> January 2021 at 7.30pm. See November Wykeham Benefice News or website for Neil's introductory letter to us.

20/032	<b>Minutes of the last meeting:</b> It was <b>RESOLVED</b> that the minutes of the meeting held on 9 <sup>th</sup> September 2020 were a correct record (unanimous) and signed by the Chairman.		
<b>20/033</b> 20/033/1	Matters arising from the minutes: The actions list was reviewed and the following discussed:  944 Restorations – Cherwell Planning Enforcement has advised that the spray booth flue is being moved further away from the boundary with the houses so that it does not require planning permission. The parts have arrived, and contractors should be installing the extension within 2 to 3 weeks. Environmental Health will then check that the emissions from the flue are within the legal limits. The flue has a filter that will collect particulates but may not have a carbon filter which will reduce smell.

There is a water standpipe in the field on the righthand side of Plot Road when driving out of Shutford. An alternative to another seat might be to landscape the area around an existing seat. The Clerk is obtaining prices of seats.
