Bug Hotel Competition


We were really impressed with the entries for the bug hotel competition, and there will be a prize for everyone who entered. Here are some comments from the judges (Carolyn

- Everyone put a lot of thought into their designs and carefully thought about what would attract or be suitable for wildlife and it is heart-warming to know that we have a few budding young wildlife enthusiasts in the village.
- The entries demonstrated a real understanding of how to attract and benefit wildlife using a wide range of materials that would provide different habitats for different creatures. The entries were also imaginative, and a lot of care and attention had gone into showing the detail of all the various compartments and the materials recommended for each one.
 Ben Whitehouse's Bird City was superbly drawn.



- Isabel Whitehouse's had a wide variety of rooms with sticks for solitary bees, dead wood for beetles and woodlice, and moss and mud for species to hibernate. There are crevices for ladybirds and spiders too. A living roof is a nice idea and should attract wildlife.
- Nell Fletcher's hedgehog house was a great reminder that we can help these declining mammals! Flowers would attract pollinating insects while brick and bark can provide places for insects to hibernate and attract beetles, earwigs, and woodlice.

Although it was very difficult to pick a winner, we all felt that **Theodore Fletcher's My Bug Manor House** was the best overall design. He used a wide range of materials that should attract a lot of different species, he also included a helpful materials list. The very grand appearance (inspired by Shutford Manor!) and use of traditional materials, would make this a valued addition to our Dairyground.


We are now planning to build **Theodore's** winning design and put it on the Dairyground.

Coronavirus has dominated life in this country for most of 2020 with devastating effects in some quarters. Although the church had to be closed for services again during November, it did open each Sunday for private prayer. Acts of Remembrance were held in church and at the war memorial on 8th November. Although the usual door to door collection for the Royal British Legion could not take place, £340 was raised for the Poppy Appeal from boxes in the George and Dragon, church, churchwarden's home and donations for the wreaths laid at the village war memorial and church roll of honour.

Online Benefice Eucharist Services were held during November and December and will continue during the present crisis. Online services were held at 10.00am but moved to 5.00pm when services resumed in church. Details of how to join are available on The Wykeham Benefice website or by contacting the churchwarden for a weekly pewsheet if not already received.

Morning Prayer on Saturday in Shutford re-started on 5th December at 9.00am and the church is open each Sunday for private prayer from about 10.30am until dusk, dependant on whether there is a service in church. Many of our parishioners are staying at home and this has been reflected in the number of people in church. The number of people worshipping in church is only about 30% of what we have witnessed in recent years, although some villagers have joined our online services. With the roll out of the coronavirus vaccine and the relaxation of restrictions, we hope worshippers will have the confidence to return to church. We must remain cautious: it is better to be safe than sorry.

Attendance at our Carol Service and at Christmas Day Family Communion was the lowest ever recorded. Some were put off by the thought of overcrowding and others not being able to sing. Both occasions were joyous with readings and recorded music by The St Martin's in the Fields singers.

The church was beautifully decorated for Christmas by our team of flower arrangers with the crib in pride of place on the font. This year our Christmas tree

was in the churchyard so everyone could see it, with solar lights twinkling after dark. A few hardy villagers braved the cold to sing carols in the churchyard by the tree on Christmas Eve at 7.00pm, others stopped to listen on their way into the pub.

In line with the Village Advent Window and light up Shutford initiative, the church tower was illuminated from Advent Sunday, 29th November until Epiphany, 6th January. We are grateful to everyone who sponsored the illuminations and made other donations raising £700 during our Advent Appeal ensuring that a predicted financial deficit in 2020 was avoided. £1275 was received from the Illuminate and Celebrate Initiative last year, most of which has been used towards our annual church building insurance of £1995.

With the absence of social fund raising and fewer people in church, we must rely on our core congregation to finance the work of the church. We have been unable to raise much money for charitable causes this year but have given £100 each to Katharine House Hospice and The Children's Society, and £75 to Shutford News for its valuable contribution to village life. Our main costs are insurance mentioned above and contributions to The Oxford Diocese of £7500 per annum to cover the cost of clergy stipends etc. Considering these costs and other expenses, we need about £220 each week to keep the church open and are thankful to everyone who have enabled this to be done.

With a difficult year behind us, we must look forward and are pleased to welcome our new Rector, the Reverend Neil Bowler who was installed and licensed on 5th January in Swalcliffe church. The event was via Zoom with The Bishop of Oxford, The Right Reverend Steven Croft officiating from his office in Oxford with just Neil and Reverend John Tattersall in Swalcliffe and Tim Huckvale recording. Special thanks to Tim for all his work with the website, Zoom services and other meetings. The maximum of 100 devices were tuned into the Installation Service, so those who missed it can look at a recording on the Benefice Website. Neil's first live service was in Shutford church on 10th January when he celebrated The Baptism of Christ. 




Shutford Book Club

All creatures great and small...Travel Adventures by Debbie Pitt

I have been so fortunate in my life to have had a great job which took me to some extraordinary places around the world. Some of these experiences I would like to share, starting off with some of the animal sightings and incidents.



I was walking in a city park in Georgetown, Guyana in South America when I happened to look into a rather sad neglected lake when, to my horror, a colossal creature appeared out of the water - it was the size of a bull seal with a very large head and far too big for such a small lake. It was, in fact a type of manatee called a dugong or sea cow. Very gentle and an herbivore luckily but not what one expects to see in a city park.

Another time I was in a remote hill area in Bangladesh staying in a basic hut when I saw a large rat scampering across the floor. I decided, as there was nothing else I could do anyway, to convince myself it was more afraid of me than I was if it.

That night I put my money belt, which also included my passport, just inches from my head but on the other side of the mosquito net. In the morning I discovered it had been chewed-included a good corner of my passport. The rat obviously decided that a British passport was not that tasty and at least left enough information on it for me to continue to travel – a

difficult one to explain to passport control why only half my name was there.

Trekking in lowlands of Nepal with my 17 year old, daughter we were told that if the guide told us to stop walking it was because he had spotted a rhino. If he then told us to turn round and walk back, then it meant that the rhino had smelt us – they have appalling eye-sight but sense of smell.

This did indeed happen, and the final instructions were to climb a tree when the rhino charged - and it was coming at full speed. I have never been good at climbing trees and I am ashamed to say that all maternal instinct left me and I pushed my way in front of my daughter and yelled at her to push me up the tree!



I did leave her a bit of space to climb up behind me which was just as well as the rhino sniffed at the bottom of the trunk for quite a while as it knew we were there but couldn't see us. A very hairy moment and more so for my daughter who never fails to retell the story whenever possible.


























