Whilst Shutford is a small rural village, which is fortunately considered low risk, emergencies do happen and whilst generally the impact will be limited in scope and severity it is important that we ensure that we have suitable communication channels and actions agreed to restrict the potential impact.

This document is intended to ensure that all necessary contact details and relevant actions are detailed in a single document which is available to everyone.

Whilst emergencies can make anyone vulnerable it is important that we recognise that some members of our community are more vulnerable than others and that our response always reflects this.
